These maps are part of a set of maps I have drawn of Japanese American businesses districts in San Francisco and other cities showing how they have changed over time.

Buildings are based on Sanborn Insurance Map Co. maps of 1910, 1929, 1951, and 1987, from microfilm at the San Francisco Public Library History Room. I redrew the maps and copied buildings forward and backward to match what existed at the featured dates, based on directory and historic photo evidence. Buildings may or may not be accurate for the dates shown.

Japanese American business and institution names are from old directories published by newspapers such as the Hokkubei Mainichi, Nichibei Times, Japanese American News, and others. They are provided courtesy of Mr. Seizo Oka, curator of the Japanese American History Archives (JAHA) in San Francisco. Maps also build on a set of maps at JAHA created in 1990 by the Japantown Arts & Media Workshop (JAM).

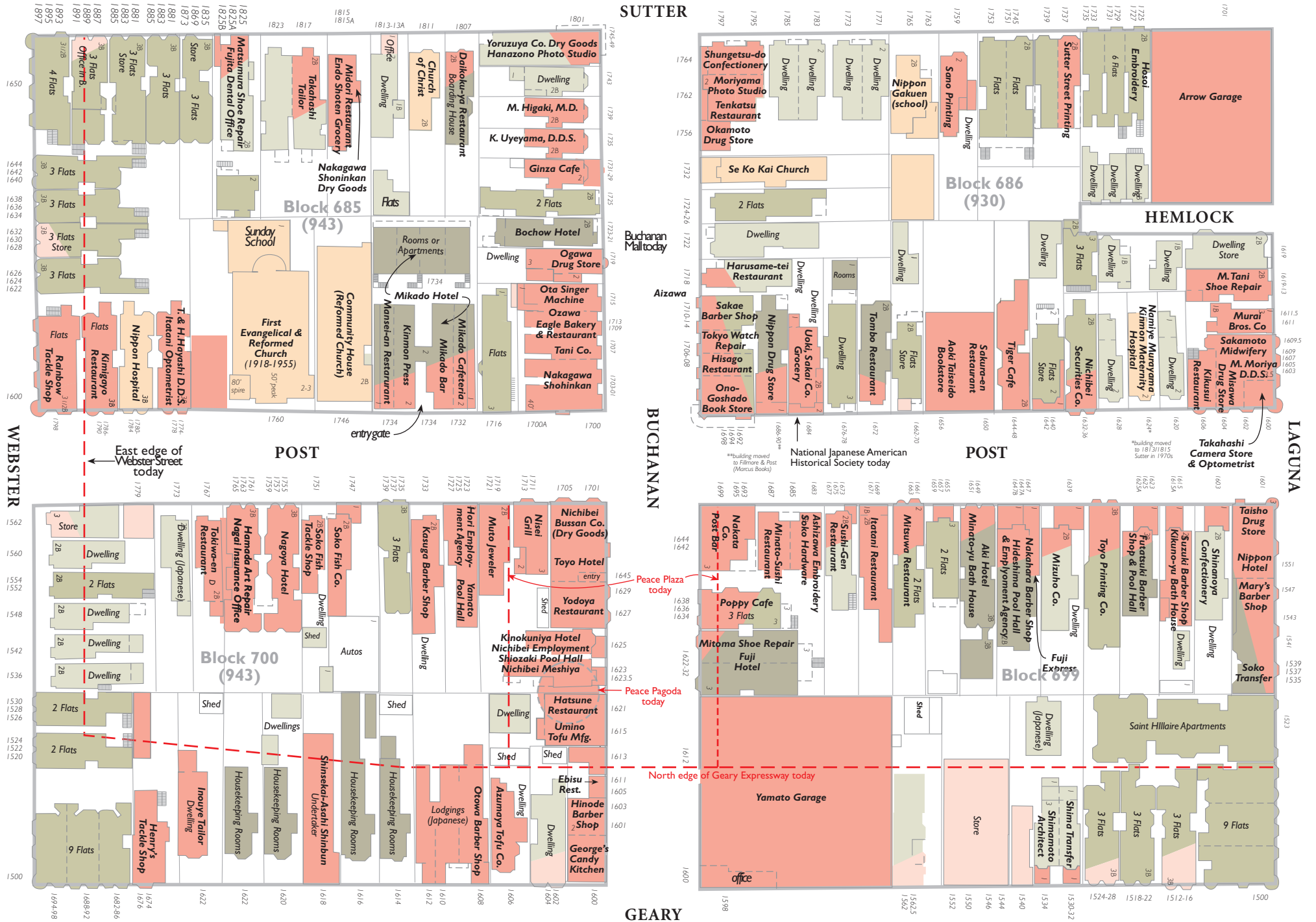
